Offensive Player of the Year Byronell Arline, Ridgewood, Sr.

His accomplishments were so impressive, nobody else even had a case. Arline's 2,188 yards eclipsed both Tyrone Tomlin's Pasco County record of 1,753 and Dwayne Mobley's Hernando County record of 2,044. He scored 35 touchdowns, and accounted for 56 percent of the Rams' total offense while leading Ridgewood to a 9-1 regular-season mark. And he accomplished all of it against defenses that knew he would get the ball.

Height/weight: 6-2, 220

Significant statistics: Carried 226 times for 2,188 yards (9.68 avg.) and 35 touchdowns. . . . more than 100 yards rushing in every regular-season game. . . . rushed for more than 300 yards in three games. . . . rushed for six touchdowns against Central and seven touchdowns against Gulf. . . . accounted for 212 of the Rams' 393 points.

Favorite moment: Arline says the Rams' playoff-clinching win over Tarpon Springs in October was the highlight of the year.

Why he wears No. 3: It is the number family member and former Tarpon Springs star running back Calvin Wood wore growing up.

What's next: Will likely play at the junior college level, possibly Butler in Kansas.

QB: Tate Humphrey, Sr. Mitchell

Completed 93-of-154 for 1,401 yards, with 13 touchdowns and six interceptions. Also rushed for 751 yards and 14 touchdowns.



WR: Jerome Harrison, Sr. Land O'Lakes

In his only season, Harrison led the Gators with 700 receiving yards and six touchdowns.



OL: John Karakaris, Sr. Ridgewood

The biggest starting lineman in the area at 6-6, 295 pounds, he'll likely get a shot in college.



OL: Tim LaRose, Sr. Nature Coast

The 6-3, 280-pound leader of the line.



RB: Byronell Arline, Sr. Ridgewood

Broke the North Suncoast single-season record with 2,188 rushing yards and 35 touchdowns.



WR: Anthony Germano, Sr. Hudson

Caught 41 passes for 773 yards and eight touchdowns. Was also third on team in tackles.



OL: Kamran Joyer, Jr. Wesley Chapel

The 6-3, 320-pounder anchored the Wildcats offensive line.



OL: Raleigh Bamberg, Sr. Land O'Lakes

The 6-3, 248-pounder blocked his way to the first team.



RB: David Williams, Sr. Gulf

Had the second-best season in North Suncoast history, finishing with 2,092 yards and 25 touchdowns on 200 carries.



TE: Nick Castellano, Sr. Land O'Lakes

Clutch receiver with 440 yards receiving and four touchdowns. Also caught key pass in Zephyrhills victory.



OL: J.D. Ramirez, Sr. Gulf

At 6-4, 280 pounds, was a big reason for Williams' success on the ground.
