Offensive Player of the Year

Brynn Harvey, Sr., Largo

When Harvey runs with the ball, the opposition holds its breath. Sometimes he blows past people, leaving them untouched except for the turbulence in his wake. Other times he hurdles over, under, around or through bodies, leaving a tangle of destruction. At 5-11 and 210 pounds, he has speed, strength in his upper and lower body, and immense gifts for deception and acceleration. This season, his physical gifts were on display as he rushed for a county-record 2,581 yards, breaking the previous mark of 2,490 set by former Packer Dexter McCluster in 2005. Harvey's running also led Largo to its first undefeated regular season in 30 years and first state semifinal appearance.

Fun fact: Harvey's father and older brother also played for Largo.

What's next: Harvey is narrowing his list of college choices, among them Arizona State, Ball State and Middle Tennessee, and likely will make a decision on national signing day (Feb. 6).

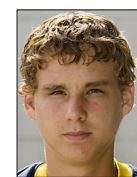
