## *St. Petersburg Times* now available on NFB-NEWSLINE®

**St. Petersburg, FL** — The *St. Petersburg Times* is now available free via telephone service to the 50,000 plus registered users of NFB-Newsline®. The NFB-Florida chapter has the largest number of registered users of any state, at over 6,700.

The *Times* joins more than 100 other national and local newspapers available via a toll-free telephone line to the blind and print handicapped members of Newsline® – the free spoken newspaper and magazine service sponsored by the National Federation of the Blind.

Text of the *St. Petersburg Times* including its dozen regional editions, is transmitted daily via a file transfer protocol to the NFB headquarters. The text-to-speech technology permits callers to hear that day's paper, the previous day's paper and the most recent Sunday newspaper.

Unlike traditional reader services, Newsline® allows callers to choose which paper is read, which sections, even allows users to skim the headlines – just like sighted readers. The speed and tone of the voice are set by the caller as well as options for repeating, spelling out words, searching and other personalized enhancements.

In addition to the *St. Petersburg Times*, NFB-Newsline® currently offers registered users the choice of seven Florida newspapers, including the *Bradenton Herald*, *Miami Herald*, *Orlando Sentinel*, *Palm Beach Post*, *Tallahassee Democrat* and *Tampa Tribune*.
